- **Youth Center Lease**

City Manager Ed Moon stated there were no changes from the previous work session and that an amendment to Restricted Use Lease Agreement for the premises located at 1128 O.G. Skinner Drive will be on the next business agenda for consideration. Both parties wish to extend the lease agreement that will end December 2017.

- **Board & Committee Appointment**

- **FEMA Flood Insurance Study**

The city ordinance requires builders to build one foot above the flood level. FEMA has raised the flood level two feet. - **Inmate Workers**

City Manager Ed Moon stated there were no changes from the previous work session. The County voted to do away with the work crews. The City use them to cut right of ways and the cemetery. The decision will cost the City approximately \$266,000. The County has indicated they will be able to provide the City with one guard and six inmate crew. Mr. Moon will continue to work with the County to find a solution.

- **Recognize Telvin Hodo (Council Meeting)**

Councilmember Benjamin F. Wilcox stated Telvin Hodo will be honored at the next business meeting for his work with the King Program.

City Manager Ed Moon stated the update of the City's Web-site was completed. It is more user friendly and he asked Council members to view the site.
